RANGE RULES

- 1. All shooting time is between 9am and 9pm. Respect the neighborhood.
- 2. Members using the range are required to have their name badges on them.
- 3. Range use is limited to the following firearms:
 - A. Rimfire Rifles and Rimfire Pistols in calibers of .17 or .22. Cartridges in hollow point and magnum are permitted.
 - B. Pistol Caliber Carbines using flat walled cartridges in .9mm, .38, .45ACP, .45 LC, .44spcl, and .30 caliber carbine.
 - C. Center fire pistol calibers in .9mm, .380, .38, .45, .44spcl, .45 pistol caliber. No center fire magnum, hollow point cartridges or wad cutters are allowed. No pistol firing a center fire rifle cartridge is allowed.
- 4. Treat all guns as though they are always loaded and always perform a clearance check every time you pick up a firearm. Open Slide and insert flag.
- 5. Keep your finger off the trigger and outside the trigger guard until you are on target and ready to shoot.
- 6. Always make sure of your target and what is beyond. Never point your gun at anything you are not willing to destroy.
- 7. All firearms will be pointed down range at all times.
- 8. No alcoholic beverages are permitted in or around the range. No person under the influence of alcohol or drugs is permitted to use the range.
- 9. Do not handle firearms when any person is forward of the yellow firing line. Take one step back from the bench.
- 10. Targets will be attached by tape to the target backing material. No staples or metal target holders are allowed.

 Metal targets are prohibited.
- 11. Controlled Firing Rate. No 'spray and pray' shooting will be tolerated.
- 12. Sign in when using the range.
- 13. Guests must read and sign the Range Waiver Form before shooting, and sign in. Please use "Guest" name badges.
- 14. Inspect the range before you shoot and look for new damage to the facility: Target area, bullet traps, ceiling, lights, exhaust fans, beams & supports. If new damage is discovered, indicate the location in the sign-in book, on the left-hand side.
- 15. Turn fans on while shooting.
- 16. Wash hands with lead removal soap, after shooting.
- 17. The Range Safety Officer (RSO) is ultimately responsible for the safe operation of shooting activities. The RSO is defined as:
 - A. The person running an organized match.
 - B. The authorized lock combination holder who opened the range for non-scheduled shooting.
